#### What about our Year 12 results?

Student results were as predicted or better than anticipated for the Year 12 ATAR Cohort. The highest Year 12 result for 2022 was 92.90, closely followed 92.40. There were three Year 11 students who sat the Year 12 ATAR Modern Greek exam. Their results ranged from 91.4 to 88.8.

Only 7 students chose an ATAR pathway at St Andrew's Grammar in 2022. Results are therefore not published in the media (to be published there must be greater than 20 students).

Students chose Curtin, ECU and UWA and entered Engineering, Architecture, Education,

Economics, Business and Health fields.

In the General pathway, there were six students who undertook the UniReady course, which provides direct entrance into Curtin University.

Of these, five students successfully

completed their course and have started at university.

Vocational studies students were also successful. A total of 27 Cert II and 2 Cert III were awarded to students in a variety of courses.

In all, our 2022 Year 12 graduates have done very well in a multiple of pathways.
