1. Policy

- 1.1 All students are expected to be dressed in the appropriate uniform for the season, term or event as outlined in the dress regulations. It is expected that all parents and guardians support the School by ensuring that their child is correctly dressed in the appropriate uniform of the day. Students are expected to abide by all dress requirements regarding personal grooming standards. Students are expected to ensure that their dress and appearance bring credit to the School and themselves.
- 1.2 Failure to do so will result in the imposition of sanctions up to and including suspension from school until the matter is rectified.
- 1.3 All parents and students have committed to upholding the uniform standards of the school during the enrolment procedures.

2. Procedures (as at 14/9/2026)

2.1 Requests for variations to this Policy

- 2.1.1 Requests for ongoing variations to this Policy for medical reasons are to be made in writing to the relevant Head of School.
- 2.1.2 Requests for ongoing variations to this Policy for any other reason – including religious requirements, are to be made in writing to CEO of SAG Inc at ceo@HCWA.org.

2.2 Dress Regulations

Overall

- All uniform items mentioned need to be school branded uniform items which are available at the school uniform shop (excluding shoes)
- Students are expected to ensure that their dress and appearance bring credit to the School and themselves.

Calendar

- Summer uniform is worn in Term 1 and 4.
- Winter uniform is worn in Term 2 and 3.
- There is a two-week transition period at the beginning of Term 2, to accommodate warm weather.

Clothing.

- Long sleeved shirts and jumpers are not permitted to be rolled up.
- There are two styles of shirt. As we transition, older style shirts need to be tucked in.
- Hem length of skirts and pinafore dresses to be no shorter than the top of the knee cap.
- Top button of shirts to be done up when wearing a tie.
- Long sleeve undergarments need to be blue or white and can only be worn with sports uniform.

Footwear

- Black lace-up school shoes - heel height maximum 3cm.
- Black leather joggers (sport shoes) or soft shoes are not permitted as school shoes.
- Sport shoes (track shoes) are to be predominantly white in colour.

Headwear

- School hats are required to be worn at recess, lunch and sport (Primary students)
- Hats must be the bucket hat or cap with the School brand.
- Students may wear a plain, white or blue school coloured Hijab, Turban or Kippah.
- A hat must still be worn for sports, recess and lunch.
- All Headwear must be worn correctly.

Hair

- Hair accessories must be navy, white or royal blue.
- Students' hair must be off the face. If of collar length or longer, all hair must be tied up at the nape of the neck.
- Dyeing of hair (of unnatural colour) and extreme hairstyles are not permitted. If a decision on extreme hairstyles is needed, it will be deferred to a Head of School, or their delegate, for a decision.
- Excessive amounts of gel or wax should not be placed in the hair.
- Boys are expected to be shaved at all times unless they have an approved variation to this Policy for medical or religious reasons (see 2.1.2)

Jewellery

- Students may wear one pair of plain ear studs or plain sleeper earrings (both ears) in the lower lobe of each ear and in no other part of the ear.
- Multiple piercings, as well as any facial or otherwise body piercings are not permitted.
- Optional jewellery includes a watch and a cross or religious medallion - chain must not be visible. Students of the Christian Orthodox faith may wear a single black prayer rope bracelet.

Other

- Nails are not permitted to extend beyond the fingertip. Nail polish is not permitted.
- Make-up, if used, should be natural. If a decision on make-up is needed, it will be deferred to a Head of School or their delegate, for a decision.
- Visible tattoos, whether permanent or applied as henna, are not considered acceptable.
- Only St Andrew's Grammar School bags may be used at the School.
